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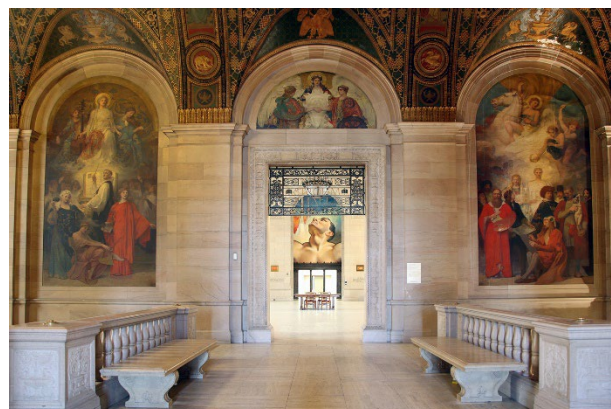
Take a Tour of the Detroit Public Library!

Detroit—Did you know there is Pewabic tile installed by Mary Chase Stratton in the Detroit Public Library? The Main Library located at 5201 Woodward Avenue is a treasure trove of murals and mosaics. Everyone is invited to learn more about the library in our new monthly “Art and Architecture Tour.”

On Sunday, October 20 at 1:30 p.m. join us for our first guided tour of Main Library and discover the original 1921 building designed by Cass Gilbert, the architect of the U.S. Supreme Court building. Learn about the murals depicting moments in Detroit history, ornate ceilings modeled after famous basilicas in Rome, and painted glass windows full of signs and symbolism. The tour will also showcase the 1963 addition designed by Cass Gilbert Jr.

According to Christopher Korenowsky, the Chief of Operations and Customer Experiences Officer at the library, “The Detroit Public Library is delighted to announce a new Sunday public service offering for customers in the form of official tours of the historic Main Library led by DPL staff. For the last century, the Main Library has ranked as one of the most beautiful buildings in Detroit.”

This monument on Woodward constructed of marble, filled with books and knowledge, and adorned with art, mosaics, and murals remains a treasure for Detroit and its citizens. All tours are FREE and open to the public—registration is required.
